Rechargeable batteries found in many common household items can spark and explode when damaged. Fires in garbage trucks and processing facilities are on the rise. Help protect our employees, haulers, property, and community.

HERE'S WHAT TO DO:

Alkaline Batteries (single-use: AA, AAA, C, D): Collect in storage bag. Once full, time for disposal.

Rechargeable Batteries: Don't store. Properly dispose of immediately.

FREE, Proper Disposal:

Lancaster County Residents: Bring to LCSWMA's Household Hazardous Waste Facility at 1299 Harrisburg Pike, Lancaster, PA, 17603
Mon. – Fri. 7:00 am to 4:00 pm; Sat. 7:00 am to 11:00 am

Ask your trash collector if they take filled battery bags. If so, place on curb beside trash. Bags are brought to LCSWMA.
